Sustainable Transportation

 - Free Rideshare program to commute to local neighborhood destinations and transit stations
- Electric Vehicle Carshare
 - The City and Colorado Carshare worked closely with Housing Authority of the City and County of Denver (DHA) and Urban Land Conservancy (ULC) to identify potential sites located in under-resourced communities that would benefit many surrounding residents and where shared EVs would complement other mobility options.

Zero Waste

- Bring Your Own Bag
 - Denver's fee on disposable bags aims to reduce the number of disposable carryout bags used, littered, and landfilled. The Bring Your Own Bag program:
 - Encourages shoppers to switch to reusable bags
 - Requires retail stores in Denver to charge ten cents (\$0.10) for each disposable bag (plastic, paper, or other material including but not limited to compostable material)
- Skip the Stuff
 - This ordinance requires all retail food establishments to provide single-use condiments and single-use service ware only upon request by a customer.
 - To make this ordinance easy to implement, the City of Denver has created printable materials to educate your customers and staff. Materials are in Vietnamese, Spanish, and English
- Expanded Waste Collection
 - The ordinance, which becomes effective in 2023, will result in weekly recycling and compost collection for City and County of Denver trash collection customers (currently, recycling is picked up every other week and compost is collected for a fee for people

who subscribe). The ordinance changes Denver's system of charging for compost collection, replacing it with a fee for trash that incentivizes recycling and composting by charging based on the size of a customer's trash cart and quantity of waste sent to the landfill.

Renewable Energy

- <u>Save on Solar</u>
 - o Solar Co-Op
 - Join the waitlist to sign up for information and group pricing discount on solar energy for your home
 - Rooftop Solar
- Solar Outdoor Learning Incentive Program
 - CASR is offering a financial incentive for public schools to incorporate solar PV into outdoor learning spaces, funding up to 100% of costs associated with the installation of the solar PV.
- Community Solar Gardens
 - The <u>Denver Solar Co-op</u> is a group-purchasing program that lowers costs for homeowners seeking to install solar and provides rebates for low-to-moderate income households interested in solar and battery storage.

Human Service Providers Incentives

- Human Service Providers can request funding to install:
 - Solar panels
 - Battery storage
 - Vehicle-to-building electric vehicle charging
 - Denver's Office of Climate Action, Sustainability, and Resiliency (CASR)'s

Renewables and Resilience Program can fund up to 100% of the costs associated with installing solar panels, battery storage and EV charging. This program supports Denver's goal of a 100% carbon-free electric grid by 2030.
